PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Goal #4 - Build a personnel/staff culture that mirrors the unique student culture that exists at Bethany.

Goal #5 - Build and equip campus with tools to tell the story of Bethany with consistency.
From these primary goals flow a number of "to do's" that have focused the activities of the College. I believe these are the right goals for the College and with the whole team being a part of formulating and moving these forward, this sets the College on a trajectory to succeed.

Bethany College has a place in the Christian Higher Educational picture in Western Canada and within our denomination. The legacy of influencing and shaping the spiritual lives and thoughts of young adults, will continue into the future as we together "Nurture Disciples, and Train Leaders to Serve."



AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Directors of Bethany College

We have audited the statement of financial position of Bethany College as at June 30, 2010 and the statements of revenue and expenditures, changes in fund balances and cash flows for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the college's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraph, we conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

In common with many charitable organizations, the college derives revenue from the general public in the form of donations, the completeness of which is not susceptible of satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of revenue from donations was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the college and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to donation revenue, excess (deficiency) of revenue over expenditures for the year, assets and fund balances.

In our opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which we might have determined to be necessary had we been able to satisfy ourselves concerning the completeness of revenue from donations referred to in the preceding paragraph, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the college as at June 30, 2010 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles.
